The Summary

"In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, saving, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!""(Mt 3:1-2) Did St. John the Baptist say those very words? Why ves, I'm sure that He did. Were those nine words (seven words in Greek) the entirety of John's message? Of course, not! Those words were a summary of his teaching. The Prophet Isaiah (40:3) foretold of John's preaching, using the summary statement, "Prepare the way of the Lord; Make His paths straight" (Mt 3:3). John also used many of his own words, for example, "Therefore bear fruits worthy of repentance..." (Mt 3:8). Not much later, St. Matthew wishes to make it clear that Jesus and John preached the same message. St. Matthew 4:17, "From that time {*after John's imprisonment* } Jesus began to preach and to say, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." Similarly, St. Mark records a



summary of John's teaching, "John came baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the remission of sins" (Mk 1:4). Not much later, he records. "Now after John was put in prison, Jesus came to Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel" (Mark 1:14-15).

The content of John the Baptist and Jesus' preaching included both law and gospel. When the preaching of the law exposes your sinfulness, the appropriate response is to repent or confess your sins. When the gospel message promises forgiveness of

sins in Jesus Christ, the appropriate response is to believe in Jesus Christ and be baptized for the forgiveness of your sins. When Jesus sent out the twelve apostles, they were directed "to preach the kingdom of God" (Lk 9:2)—a short hand way of saying the same Law and Gospel as Jesus and John the Baptist. When Jesus sent out the seventy, he includes, "The kingdom of God has come near to you" (Lk 10:9) as well as another summary statement, "Peace to this house" (Lk 10:5). Not only would these sent ones have said these words, but they would have further explained with many other words.

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The Summary

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One who repented and believed the good news of peace would then be called "a son of peace" (Lk 10:6).

Prior to the suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ, many things needed to be said in "figures of speech" (Jn 16:29), but following His resurrection, the particulars of this good news of forgiveness are clearly proclaimed. Jesus begins His resurrection preaching tour with the summary statement, "Peace to you" (Lk 24:36). A little later, He expounds on His message and sends the disciples out to preach the same message preached by John and Himself. St. Luke 24:46-49, "Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day, and that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. And you are witnesses of these things. Behold, I send the Promise of My Father upon you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high."

Did these Apostolic witnesses of His resurrection preach that same message of law and gospel? Absolutely! After exposing sins by the law, St. Peter on the day of Pentecost told the gathered hearers, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to vour children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call" (Acts 2:38-39). The summary of what Peter preached was also explained more fully. "And with many other words he testified and exhorted them, saying, 'Be saved from this perverse generation" (v.40).

The summary of what the church preaches today is this same message of law and gospel, repent and believe, sin and Jesus, the things that make for peace and the coming of the kingdom of God. For the pastor, St. Paul tells Timothy, "Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me, in faith and love which are in Christ Jesus. That good thing which was committed to you, keep by the Holy Spirit who dwells in us" (2 Timothy 1:13-14). Likewise, God desires

that the hearers cling to that same churchly message, "This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, (1 Tim 1:15). "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful" (Hebrews 10:23). The Galatians were reminded that they received the Holy Spirit "by the hearing of faith" (3:2), and it would be "foolish" (3:3) to leave it behind. Colossians 2:6-7 says, "As you have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, as you have been taught, abounding in it with thanksgiving."

There is a reason for God's insistence on the pastor holding out the same trustworthy message and the hearer being faithful to that Christian doctrine unto death (Rev 2:10). 1 Timothy 4:16 says, "Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you." --MDH
