### Which Genus?

- 1. **The Idiomaticum Genus** Christ has two distinct natures, human and divine, each of which has its own essential attributes, functions, and activities. The attributes, functions, and activities of either may be ascribed to the entire Person.
- 2. **The Maiestaticum Genus -** When the Son of God assumed the human nature, He imparted and communicated to it divine majesty, glory, and attributes. However, the human nature does not impart its attributes to the Divine nature so as to limit or diminish it in any way.
- 3. **The Apotelesmaticum Genus -** Whatever the Savior did and still does to save sinful mankind (His official acts) may not be ascribed to either of His natures exclusively, but must be ascribed to both natures conjointly.

## STATE OF EXALTATION Philippians 2:9-11 (NIV)

9 Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, 10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

### **Explanation:**

- --The Christ is true God (equal to the Father) --He did not remain as exclusively Divine (insisting upon using his equality with God),
- --<u>He did not fully use</u> the power of His divine attributes, so that He might be our Servant
- --The Christ took on a human nature (became man)
- --To our eyes, God appearing as a Man-Servant
- --Not fully and always making use of His divine attributes, He suffered and died.

#### **Explanation:**

- In time the human nature receives exaltation and the Name Jesus (Yahweh saves)
- --When the Christ has laid aside the infirmities of the flesh, He <u>fully exercises his</u> <u>divine majesty</u>.

Ephesians 4:9-10 (Now this, "He ascended"—what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? 10He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.)

"Whatever Christ received **in time** He received according to His human nature(at the incarnation), not according to the divine nature(eternal generation)."

What about a fourth genus? **Formula of Concord, Ep. VIII, 39**] 20. When it is taught, and the passage Matt. 28, 18: *All power is given unto Me*, etc., is thus interpreted and blasphemously perverted, namely, that all power in heaven and on earth was restored, that is, delivered again to Christ according to the divine nature, at the resurrection and His ascension to heaven, as though He had also according to His divinity laid this aside and abandoned it in His state of humiliation. By this doctrine not only the words of the testament of Christ are perverted, but also the way is prepared for the accursed Arian heresy, so that finally the eternal deity of Christ is denied, and thus Christ, and with Him our salvation, are entirely lost if this false doctrine were not firmly contradicted from the immovable foundation of the divine Word and our simple Christian [catholic] faith.
