Fall of Northern Kingdom

Division of Northern Kingdom

1 Kings 11:26 Jeroboam rebelled against Solomon

v.30 Ahijah prophesied — clock in 12 pieces
10 pieces for yourself
1 tribe — a lamp before me +
walk in my ways v.36

v.40 Jeroboam flies to Egypt

12:1 Rehoboam to be King

heavy burden — taxation
harsh labor

listen to young men, made load heavier

v.16-17 Israel left and would not recognize Rehoboam

v.18 Adoniram killed trying to force labor

v.20 Jeroboam made king when he returned from Egypt

v.21-24 Rehoboam did not go to war against Israel

Golden Calves

- v.25 Jeroboam lived at Shechem
 - 28 Two golden calves at Bethel and Dan
 - 31 Appointed priests (not Levites), even himself
 - 33 Set up his own times
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Prophecy against Jeroboam's worship

13:2 A son named Josiah (ruled in Judah 300 years later)
