Extra Credit 2: For the believer two things must grow together?

1. Synecdoche uses the part for the whole or the whole for the part. Here Jesus comprehends both the cause and the effect. Her love comes from the faith.
2. Later Jesus says, "You faith has saved you."
3. "The woman came with the opinion concerning Christ that with Him the remission of sins should be sought. This worship is the highest worship of Christ. Nothing greater could she ascribe to Christ. To seek from Him the remission of sins was truly to acknowledge the Messiah" (Ap IV III 33).
