Communion

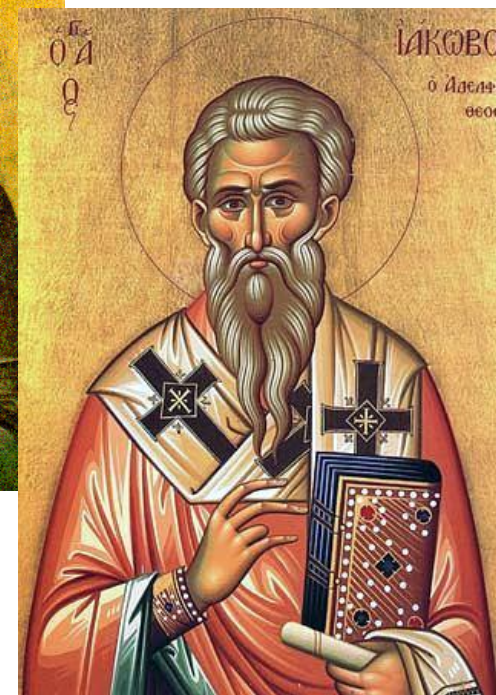
Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not / known Me?
