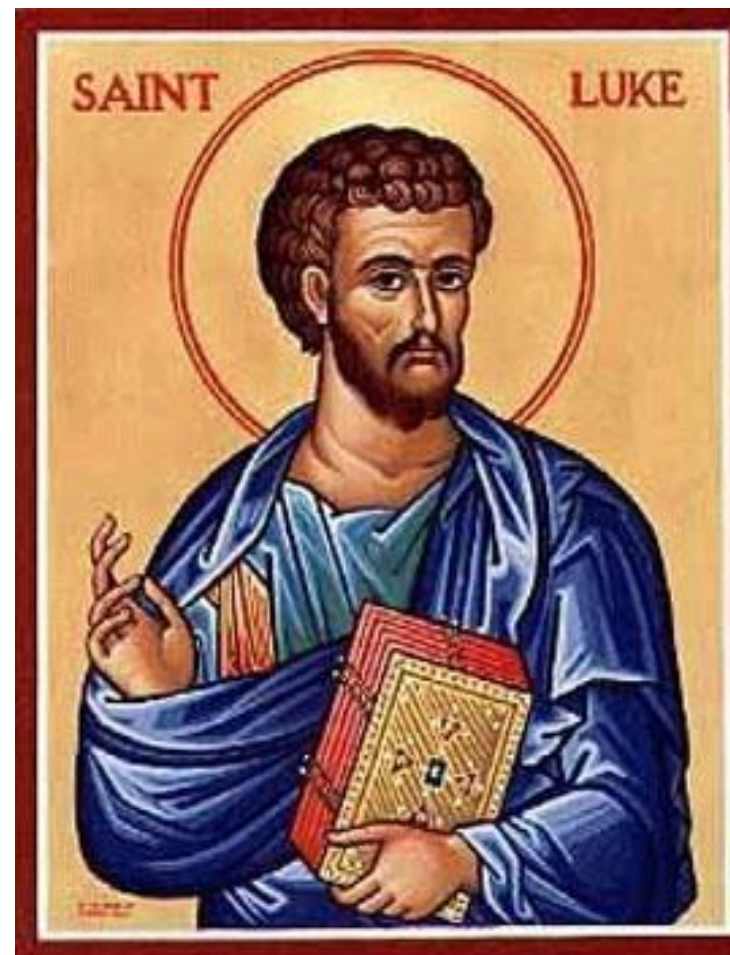

And to the Ho-ly Spir-it.

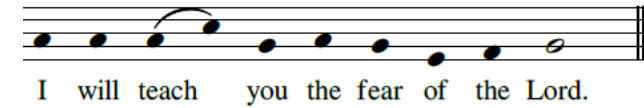
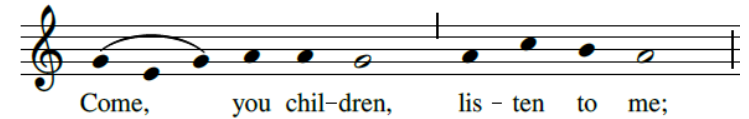
