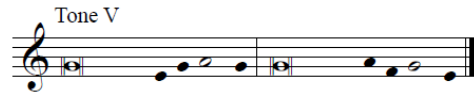

## Epiphany One Psalms



### Psalm 45

*After three days they found him in the temple, sitting a-mong the teach-ers,*

*listening to them and ask-ing them ques-tions.*

**People: My heart is overflowing with a good theme; I recite my composition con-cern-ing the King;**

**My tongue is the pen of a read-y wri-ter.**

2 You are fairer than the sons of men;

Grace is poured upon Your lips; Therefore God has blessed You for-ev-er.

**3 Gird Your sword upon Your thigh, O Mighty One, With Your glory and Your majes-ty.**

4 And in Your majesty ride prosperously because of truth, humili-ty, and righteous-ness;

And Your right hand shall teach You awesome things.

**5 Your arrows are sharp in the heart of the King's ene-mies;**

**The peo-ples fall under You.**

6 Your throne, O God, is forev-er and ev-er;

A scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Your king-dom.

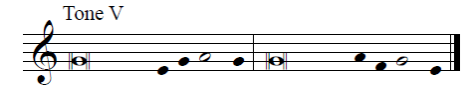
**7 You love righteousness and hate wicked-ness;**

**Therefore God, Your God, has anointed You With the oil of gladness more than Your com-pan-ions.**

8 All Your garments are scented with myrrh and al-oes and cassi-a,

Out of the ivory palaces, by which they have made You glad.

9 Kings' daughters are among Your honor-a-ble wo-men;



**At Your right hand stands the queen in gold from Oph-ir.**

10 Listen, O daughter, Consider and in-cline your ear; Forget your own people also, and your father's house;

**11 So the King will greatly de-sire your beau-ty; Because He is your Lord, worship Him.**

12 And the daughter of Tyre will come with a gift; The rich among the people will seek your fa-vor.

**13 The royal daughter is all glorious with-in the pal-ace; Her clothing is wo-ven with gold.**

14 She shall be brought to the King in robes of man-y col-ors;

The virgins, her companions who follow her, shall be brought to You.

**15 With gladness and rejoicing they shall be brought; They shall enter the King's pal-ace.**

16 Instead of Your fathers shall be Your sons, Whom You shall make princes in all the earth.

**17 I will make Your name to be remembered in all gen-er-a-tions;**

**Therefore the people shall praise You forev-er and ev-er.**

**And to the Ho-ly Spir-it.**

## Psalm 84



*The mother of Jesus said to him, "Son, why have you treat-ed us so?*

*Behold, your father and I have been searching for you in great dis-tress.*

**People: How lovely is Your tabernacle, O Lord of hosts!**

**2 My soul longs, yes, even faints For the courts of the Lord; My heart and my flesh cry out for the living God.**

3 Even the sparrow has found a home, And the swallow a nest for herself, Where she may lay her young—

Even Your altars, O Lord of hosts, My King and my God.

**4 Blessed are those who dwel in Your house; They will still be praising You.**

5 Blessed is the man whose strength is in You, Whose heart is set on pilgrim-age.

**6 As they pass through the Valley of Baca, They make it a spring;**

The rain also cov-ers it with pools.

7 They go from strength to strength;

Each one appears before God in Zi-on.

**8 O Lord God of hosts, hear my prayer;**

Give ear, O God of Ja-cob!

9 O God, be-hold our shield,

And look upon the face of Your a-noint-ed.

**10 For a day in Your courts is better than a thou-sand.**

I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God Than dwell in the tents of wicked-ness.

6 He also established them forev-er and ev-er;

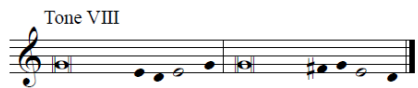
He made a decree which shall not pass a-way.
