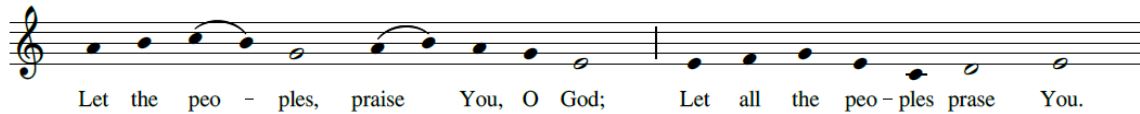

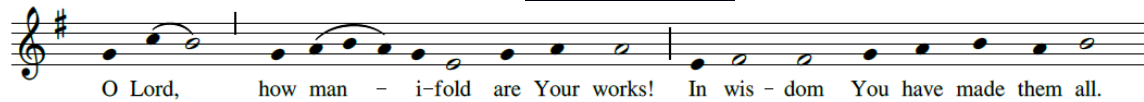
Psalm 67

To the Chief Musician. On Stringed Instruments. A Psalm. A Song.



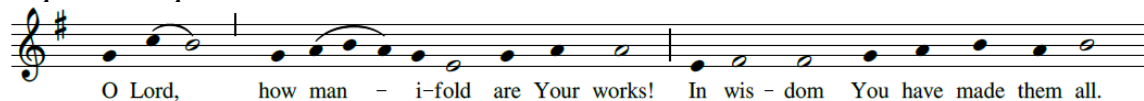
- 1 God be merciful to us and bless us,

Psalm 104



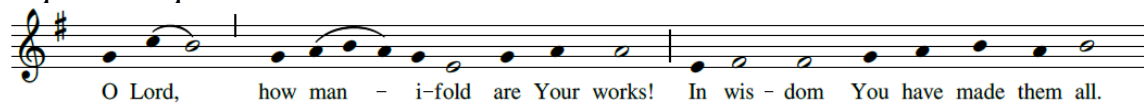
- 1 Bless the Lord, O my soul! O Lord my God, You are very great:

That they may not return to cov-er the earth.

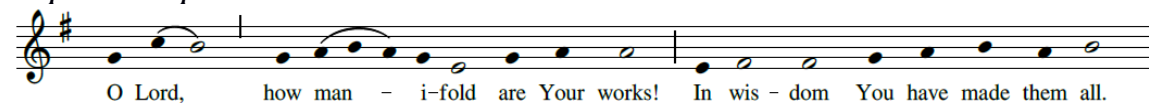

They sing a-mong the branch-es.

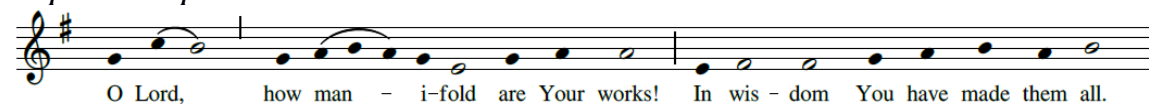
13 He waters the hills from His up-per cham-bers;

 And to his labor un-til the eve-ning.

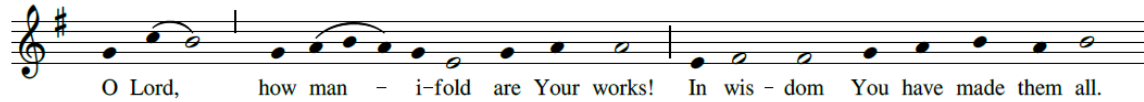

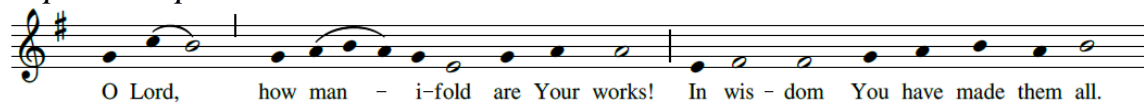


31 May the glory of the Lord en-dure for-ev-er;

Is now, and will be for-ev-er. A-men.

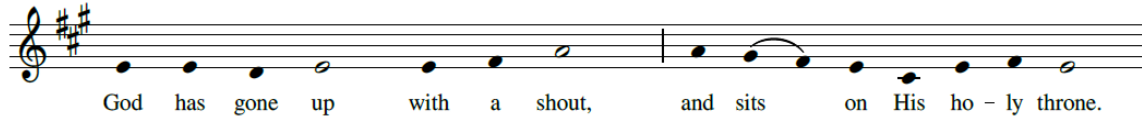
