#66 God Help Us As We Do Our Part as Christians

I can see there in the distance how the devil is puffing out his cheeks so vigorously that he is turning all red as he

prepares to blow and rage. But our Lord Christ from the beginning (even when he was in the flesh) struck these puffed cheeks with his fist, so that they emitted nothing but the devil's stinking wind. He still does this today and will ever continue to do so. For Christ does not lie when he declares, "I am with you always, to the close of the age" [Matt. 28:20], and when he assures us that the gates of hell shall not prevail against the church [Matt. 16:18]. At the same time we are enjoined to remain awake and to do our part in preserving the light. We read, "Be watchful," for the devil is called a "roaring lion" who "prowls around, seeking some one to devour" [I Pet. 5:8], and this he did not only in the days of the apostles when St. Peter uttered these words; he does so to the end of time. Let us be guided by this. God help us as he helped our forefathers, and as he will help our heirs, to the honor and glory of his divine name forever. For after all, we are not the ones who can preserve the church, nor were our forefathers able to do so. Nor will our successors have this power. No, it was, is, and will be he who says, "I am with you always, to the close of the age." As it says in Hebrews 13 [:8], "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, and today, and forever," and in Revelation 1 [:8], "He who is and who was and who is to come." This is his name and no one else's; nor may anyone else be called by that name.
