
Psalms for Advent 1 Vespers



Psalm 24



Advent Antiphon:

Behold, the name of the Lord <u>comes from</u> a-far:

and let the whole earth be filled with His glo-ry.

1 The earth is the Lord's, and all its full-ness,

The world and those who dwell there-in.

2 For He has founded it up-on the seas,

And established it up-on the wa-ters.

3 Who may ascend into the hill of the Lord?

Or who may stand in His holy place?

4 He who has clean hands and a pure heart,

Who has not lifted up his soul to an idol, Nor sworn de-ceitful-ly.

5 He shall receive <u>bless-ing</u> from the <u>Lord</u>,

And righteousness from the God of his sal-va-tion.

Advent Antiphon:

Out of Zion, the perfection of <u>beau-ty</u>, God has <u>shined</u>.

Our God shall come, <u>al-le</u>-lu-<u>ia</u>.

1 The Mighty One, God the Lord, Has spo-ken and called the earth From the rising of the sun to its going down.

2 Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, <u>God will</u> shine <u>forth</u>.

3 Our God shall come, and shall not keep si-lent;

A fire shall de-vour be-fore Him,

And it shall be very tempestuous <u>all a-round Him</u>.

4 He shall call to the heav-ens from a-bove,

And to the earth, that He may judge His peo-ple:

5 "Gather My saints to-geth-er to Me,

Those who have made a covenant with Me by sacri-fice."

6 Let the heavens de-<u>clare His</u> righteous-<u>ness</u>,

For God Him-self is Judge.

7 "Hear, O My people, and I will speak, O Israel, and I will testi-<u>fy</u> <u>a</u>-gainst <u>you</u>; I am <u>God</u>, <u>your God</u>!

8 I will not rebuke you for your sacrifices Or your burnt offer-ings,

Which are continual-ly be-fore Me.

9 I will not take a bull from your house,

Nor goats out of your folds.

10 For every beast of the <u>for-est</u> is <u>Mine</u>,

And the cattle on a thousand hills.

11 I know all the birds of the moun-tains,

And the wild beasts of the field are Mine.

12 "If I were hungry, I would not tell you;

For the world is Mine, and all its full-ness.

13 Will I eat the flesh of bulls,

Or <u>drink</u> the blood of goats?

14 Offer to God thanks-giv-ing,

And pay your vows to the Most High.

15 Call upon Me in the day of trou-ble;

I will deliver you, and you shall glo-ri-fy Me."

Advent Antiphon:

Prepare the way of the Lord, al-le-lu-ia.

Make His paths straight, <u>al-le</u>-lu-<u>ia</u>.

16 But to the wicked God says: "What right have you to de-<u>clare My</u> stat-<u>utes</u>, Or take My covenant in your mo<u>uth</u>,

17 Seeing you hate in-struc-tion

And cast My words be-hind you?

18 When you saw a thief, you con-sen-ted with him,

And have been a partaker with a-dulter-ers.

19 You give your mouth to e-vil,

And your tongue frames de-ceit.

20 You sit and speak a-gainst your broth-er;

You slander your own mother's son.

21 These things you have done, and I kept si-lent;

You thought that I was alto-geth-er like you;

But I will re-buke you,

And set them in or-der be-fore your eyes.

22 "Now consider this, you who for-get God,

Lest I tear you in pieces, And there be none to de-liv-er:

23 Whoever offers praise glo-ri-fies Me;

And to him who orders his conduct aright I will show the sal-va-tion of God."

Advent Antiphon:

Rain down, you heavens, from above, And let the skies pour down righteous-ness;

Let the earth open, let them bring <u>forth</u> <u>sal</u>-va-<u>tion</u>.

1 Lord, You have been favora-ble to Your land;

You have brought back the captivi-ty of Ja-cob.

2 You have forgiven the iniquity of Your peo-ple;

You have <u>cov-ered</u> all their <u>sin</u>.

3 You have taken a-way all Your wrath;

You have turned from the fierceness of Your an-ger.

4 Restore us, O God of our sal-va-tion,

And cause Your anger toward us to cease.

5 Will You be angry with <u>us for-ev-er?</u>

Will You prolong Your anger to all gen-er-a-tions?

6 Will You not re-vive us a-gain,

That Your people may re-joice in You?

7 Show us Your mercy, Lord,

And grant us Your sal-va-tion.

8 I will hear what God the Lord will speak, For He will speak peace To His people <u>and to His saints</u>;

But let them not turn <u>back</u> to fol-<u>ly</u>.

9 Surely His salvation is near to those who fear Him,

That glory may dwell in our land.

10 Mercy and truth have met to-geth-er;

Righteous-ness and peace have kissed.

11 Truth shall spring out of the earth,

And righteousness shall look <u>down from</u> heav-<u>en</u>.

12 Yes, the Lord will give what is good;"

And our land will yield its in-crease.

13 Righteousness will go be-fore Him,

And shall make His foot-steps our path-way.

Advent Antiphon:

Come, O Lord, and <u>make no</u> tarry-<u>ing</u>:

loosen the bonds of Thy peo-ple Isra-el.

(BPB 2, Isaiah 52:2)

1 Hear my prayer, O Lord, Give ear to my sup-pli-ca-tions!

In Your faithfulness answer me, And <u>in Your</u> righteous-<u>ness</u>.

2 Do not enter into judgment with Your ser-vant,

For in Your sight no one liv-ing is right-eous.

3 For the enemy has perse-<u>cut-ed</u> my <u>soul</u>;

He has crushed my life to the ground;

He has made me dwell in dark-ness,

Like those who have long been dead.

4 Therefore my spirit is over-whelmed with-in me;

My heart with-<u>in</u> me is dis-<u>tressed</u>.

5 I remember the days of old; I medi-tate on all Your works;

I muse on the work of Your hands.

6 I spread out my hands to You;

My soul longs for You <u>like a thirsty land</u>.

7 Answer me speedily, O Lord; My spirit fails!

Do not hide Your face from me, Lest I be like those who go down in-to the pit.

8 Cause me to hear Your lovingkindness in the morn-ing,

For in You do I trust;

Cause me to know the way in which I should walk,

For I lift up my soul to You.

9 Deliver me, O Lord, from my ene-mies;

In You I take shel-ter.

10 Teach me to do Your will, For You are my God;

Your Spirit is good. Lead me in the <u>land of upright-ness</u>.

11 Revive me, O Lord, for Your name's sake!

For Your righteousness' sake bring my soul out of trou-ble.

12 In Your mercy cut off my enemies,

And destroy all those who af-flict my soul;

For I am Your ser-vant.

Advent Antiphon:

2 Every day <u>I</u> will bless <u>You</u>,

And I will praise Your name forev-er and ev-er.

3 Great is the Lord, and great-ly to be praised;

And His greatness is un-searcha-ble.

4 One generation shall praise Your works to an-oth-er,

And shall de-<u>clare Your</u> mighty <u>acts</u>.

5 I will meditate on the glorious splendor of Your majes-ty,

And on Your wondrous works.

6 Men shall speak of the might of Your awesome acts,

And I will de-clare Your great-ness.

7 They shall utter the memory of <u>Your great</u> good-<u>ness</u>,

And shall sing of Your righteous-ness.

Rejoice greatly, O Je-rusa-lem:

behold, thy King com-eth. (BPB 3, Zech 9:9)

15 The eyes of all look ex-pect-ant-ly to You,

And You give them their food in due sea-son.

16 You o-pen Your hand

And satisfy the desire of eve-ry living thing.

In that day the mountains shall <u>drop down</u> sweet-<u>ness</u>,

and the hills shall flow with milk and honey, <u>al-le-lu-ia</u>.

(DO Lauds Lev 20:24)

Verse/Response:

Antiphon, Magnificat:

Behold, the name of the Lord is <u>com-ing</u> from a-<u>far</u>: and His Glory <u>fills the</u> whole <u>world</u>.
