Guard your steps when you go to the house of God.



The house of God, or the temple, was instituted ... for the purpose of preaching, so that there would be a gathering of the people of God there to listen to the Word from their God. ... For every Word of God, whether it deals with the peace of conscience or with external peace, is followed by offense. ...In sum, the Word is an offense and foolishness to the flesh.... But if you want to avoid all offenses, turn yourself over to the Word and work of God, putting aside and casting away all your own thoughts and counsels. Let yourself be spoken to, prick up your ears, and come close to listen." For in all the affairs of man and God our way is never safe unless we turn ourselves over completely to the Word and work of God and take our stand on it without any debate about it in our mind" (Luther's Works, v.15, p.75).
