#9B. Do all in the name of Jesus Christ

Now where are those who ask what works are good, what they shall do, how shall they be good? Yes, and where, too, are those who say that when we preach about faith we do not

teach works or say they should be done? Does not this single first commandment give us more work to do than any one man can do? If a man were a thousand men, if he were all men in one, if he comprised all creatures, there is still enough asked of him—and more than enough—since he is commanded to live and walk at all times in faith and trust toward God, to place such faith in no one else and in this way to have no other God, just the one and only true God.

Now since the being and nature of man cannot exist for an instant unless it is doing or not doing something, putting up with or running away from something (for as we know, life never stands still), well then, let him who wants to be holy and full of good works begin to exercise himself at all times in this faith in all his life and works. Let him learn to do and to leave undone all things in such continual faith. Then he will find how much work he has to do, and how completely all things are included in faith, and how he may never grow idle because his very idling must be the exercise and work of faith. In short, nothing can be in or about us and nothing can happen to us but what must be good and serviceable to us, as long as we believe (as we ought) that all things please God. So says St. Paul, "Dear brethren, all that you do, whether you eat or drink, **do all in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord"** [I Cor. 10:31]. Now it cannot be done in this name except it be done in this faith. Likewise, Romans 8[:28], "We know that all things work together for good to the saints of God" (Luther's Works, v. 44, p.33)

General Prayer of the Church

This evening we will be using a prayer from "Prayers for Feasts, Festivals, and Holidays" from The Lutheran Liturgy(p.337).

O Lord Jesus Christ, Thou Savior of the world, who, being made man for our sakes, didst endure the circumcision of the flesh to satisfy the demands of the Law and the eternal justice of God by Thy perfect obedience, that we might obtain the forgiveness of sins in Thy name, we praise Thee for Thy goodness and glorify Thy marvelous works for our salvation. And we beseech Thee to count Thy perfect merit unto our faith for righteousness and to plead our cause when our misdeeds rise up to testify against us. Teach us to reverence and faithfully to use Thy Word and the blessed Sacraments, cleanse us daily from our sins with Thy precious blood, and grant us the true circumcision of the heart, in the spirit, that we may by faith be consecrated, as instruments of righteousness, to Thy service. Give us grace to withstand all temptations and with pure hearts and minds to follow Thee, loving the thing which Thou commandest and desiring only what Thou hast promised, that among the manifold changes of this present world our hearts may surely there be fixed where true joys are to be found. Sustain us in our trials, keep us in the path in which we should go, and hereafter receive us into the kingdom of Thy glory.

Grant this, most heartily beloved Redeemer, for Your most blessed and holy Name--Jesus. Amen. (Loehe, 270)

Trinity Lutheran Church observes the Scriptural practice (*Eph 4:3, 2 John 1:10-11*) of communing only with those for whom their public profession of faith (congregational

membership) is in agreement with God's Word and the correct exposition of Holy Scripture as found in the Book of Concord (1580). All who desire to receive Christ's Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins are asked to speak with Pastor Henson before coming forward to commune.

Trinity Lutheran Church is served by pastors who are members of the Evangelical Lutheran Diocese of North America(Eldona.org).

- --Those who are members of Eldona-affiliated congregations are welcome to commune after announcing to Pastor Henson.
- --Those who are not members of Eldona-affiliated congregations will need to set up an appointment with Pastor Henson to discuss their public church membership.

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Trinity Lutheran Church in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but **His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another.** Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until He comes.

Those who are not yet invited to receive the Sacrament are encouraged to meditate on God's Word in the distribution hymns and pray for the day when our divisions will have ceased.
