#36 Be Content with What Comes From God’s Hand

The same thing happens in other areas of life. One seeks pleasure in love but soon experiences bitterness. Augustine also complains in his *Confessions* that he was tormented horribly in the very midst of his amorous affairs. Thus when we seize upon pleasure, it is soon covered with bitterness. **Therefore, the best thing is to abide in the Word and work of God, to instruct the heart this way in how to be peaceful and content with the things that are present.** If the Lord has given one a wife, one should now hold on to her and enjoy her. If you want to exceed these limits and add to this gift which you have in the present, you will get grief and sorrow instead of pleasure. One should therefore simply stick to what the Lord wills and gives. If you want joy and delight, wait to receive it from Him. As He offers it to you, accept it. "Rejoice with those who rejoice" (Rom. 12:15). Do not try to be wise and solemn in the midst of those who are rejoicing, as sanctimonious people do, who dampen the happiness of other people, which God has given. Just be sure to acknowledge that all of this comes to you from God; accept it from His hand and use it as His gift. (Luther’s Works, v.15 p.29-30)

The Lord's Supper

Trinity Lutheran Church observes the Scriptural practice (*Eph 4:3, 2 John 1:10-11*) of communing only with those for whom their public profession of faith (congregational membership) is in agreement with God's Word and the correct exposition of Holy Scripture as found in the Book of Concord (1580). All who desire to receive Christ's Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins are asked to speak with Pastor Henson before coming forward to commune.

Trinity Lutheran Church is served by pastors who are members of the Evangelical Lutheran Diocese of North America (Eldona.org).

--Those who are members of Eldona-affiliated congregations are welcome to commune after announcing to Pastor Henson.

--Those who are not members of Eldona-affiliated congregations will need to set up an appointment with Pastor Henson to discuss their public church membership.

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Trinity Lutheran Church in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until He comes.

Those who are not yet invited to receive the Sacrament are encouraged to meditate on God's Word in the distribution hymns and pray for the day when our divisions will have ceased.



The 2022 Annual Bike with Pastor Mike (and picnic).—is next Sunday (5/15)!

Here's the plan: We're all going to meet at Vienna Park at **2:30 PM.**

You can either ride 20 miles or 10 miles.

For 10 miles riders: Using a couple of vehicles we will transport bikes and riders to the start at Tunnel Hill to begin the bike ride. We will bike 10 miles from the town of Tunnel Hill (just north of the Tunnel) back to Vienna Park. The trail is slightly downhill all the way. You can't pick up your feet and coast, but it's not a difficult ride at all. Just in case we have any bike (or people) breakdowns. I will have a SAG wagon appointed. They will be available to pick up stragglers at $\frac{3}{4}$ mile and at $6 \frac{1}{3}$ miles.

For those 20 mile riders: They can simply ride from Vienna Park to Tunnel Hill and back.

We would like to get a picture at 2:35 PM at Tunnel Hill, before either group starts.

To get to Vienna Park from Herrin: Take 148 to Route 24 South. Take exit 16 the Vienna/Golconda exit onto Route 146. Go right(west) toward Vienna. The Park is a mile off the road on the right.

To go straight to Tunnel Hill(bike starting point) from Herrin: Take 148 to Route 24 South. Take the Tunnel Hill exit #7 and go Left(east) on Route 12. It winds around quite a bit, but it will take you there.

The drivers and picnic-ers will await the arrival of the bikers in Vienna Park for a picnic.
