## **Confession**

P. and C. O Almighty God, merciful Father, I, a poor, miserable sinner,

confess unto Thee all my sins and iniquities with which I have offended Thee and justly deserved Thy temporal and eternal punishment.

But I am heartily sorry for them and truly repent of them,

and I pray Thee of Thy boundless mercy, and for the sake of the holy innocent, bitter suffering and death of Thy beloved Son, Jesus Christ to be gracious to me, **a poor sinful being.** 

Absolution (indicative operative, "I")

P. Upon this your confession,

I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you

who heartily repent of your sins, believe on Jesus Christ, and sincerely and earnestly purpose by the assistance of God the Holy Ghost hence forth to amend your sinful lives,

and **in the stead and by the command** of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgiven you all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost.

#### **Confession**

Wherefore we flee for refuge to Thine infinity mercy, seeking and imploring Thy grace, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ.

### Prayer Prayer

P. and C. O Most Merciful God, who has given thine Only-begotten Son to die for us, have mercy upon us, and for His sake grant us remission of all our sins; and by Thy Holy Spirit increase in us true knowledge of Thee, and of Thy will, and true obedience to Thy Word, to the end that by Thy grace we may come to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

**Declaration of Grace** (optative, "We") P. Almighty God, our heavenly Father, hath had mercy upon us, and hath given his only Son to die for us, and for his sake forgiveth us all our sins. **To them that believe on his Name,** he giveth power to become the sons of God, and hath promise them his Holy Spirit. He that believeth, and is baptized, shall be saved. Grant this, Lord, unto us all. C. Amen

From Melancthon's church order for Mecklenburg 1545, Wittenberg 1559, and then in Evangelical Lutheran Hymn-Book, 1912. Hebrews 10:22 let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

**1 John 1:8-9** If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup>If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

**Proverbs 28:13** He who covers his sins will not prosper, But whoever confesses and forsakes them will have mercy.

**John 20:21-23** So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." <sup>22</sup>And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. <sup>23</sup>If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

# AC II: Of Original Sin.

1] Also they teach that since the fall of Adam all men begotten in the natural way are born with sin, that is, without the fear of God, without trust in God, and with 2] concupiscence; and that this *disease*, or *vice of origin*, is truly sin, even now condemning and bringing eternal death upon those not born again through Baptism and the Holy Ghost....

# AC, XXV: Of Confession.

1] Confession in the churches is not abolished among us; for it is not usual to give the body of the Lord, except to them that have been previously examined and absolved. And 2] the people are most carefully taught concerning faith in the absolution, about which formerly there 3] was profound silence. Our people are taught that they should highly prize the absolution, as being the voice of God, 4] and pronounced by God's command. The power of the Keys is set forth in its beauty and they are reminded what great consolation it brings to anxious consciences, also, that God requires faith to believe such absolution as a voice sounding from heaven, and that such faith in Christ truly obtains and receives the forgiveness of sins....

**Martin Chemnitz** in his *Enchiridion* does mention both a private and general confession of sins (p.136-137). He also includes a corporate confession and absolution in his *Church Order for Braunschweig-Wolfenbüttel*, 1569, which is quite similar to the general absolution in ASBH. (*Church Order* by CPH 2015, p.84-85)
