## **#3 Do Not Be Offend by This Lowly Christ**

For no emperor, king or temporal authority, with all their power, can deliver you from one sin, or with their money and goods heal the least disease, much less afford help against eternal death and hell. But this lovely King, Christ, delivers me, not only from one sin, but from all my

sins, and not me only, but the whole world. He comes to take away not only sickness, but death, and not only from me, but from the whole world. This is what the Evangelist desires to have announced to the daughter of

Zion from the prophet; **not to be offended** at His lowly coming, but to close the eyes and open the ears, that she may not see in what poverty He rides, but hear what is said of this poor King. Reason looks only on this poor and humble form, that He rides upon an ass without saddle or spurs, like a beggar, and is offended at it; but does not see that He can deliver us from sin, destroy death, and give us everlasting holiness, righteousness, eternal salvation and eternal life. Therefore we must tell and proclaim it, that the people may hear and believe. This is what the Evangelist means when he says: "Tell ye the daughter of Zion." Why? In order that she may know it, and not heed, nor be offended at this, that He comes in such poverty and soon after dies ignominiously. For all this takes place for your good, in order that He, as a Savior, may help you against the devil and death, to sanctify and deliver you from sin. #### Malachi 3:1-6

<sup>1</sup>"Behold, I send My messenger, And he will prepare the way before Me. And the Lord, whom you seek, Will suddenly come to His temple, Even the Messenger of the covenant, In whom you delight. Behold, He is coming," Says the LORD of hosts.<sup>2</sup>"But who can endure the day of His coming? And who can stand when He appears? For He is like a refiner's fire And like launderer's soap.<sup>3</sup>He will sit as a refiner and a purifier of silver; He will purify the sons of Levi, And purge them as gold and silver, That they may offer to the LORD An offering in righteousness.<sup>4</sup>"Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem Will be pleasant to the LORD, As in the days of old, As in former years.<sup>5</sup>And I will come near you for judgment; I will be a swift witness Against sorcerers, Against adulterers, Against perjurers, Against those who exploit wage earners and widows and orphans, And against those who turn away an alien-Because they do not fear Me," Says the LORD of hosts.<sup>6</sup>"For I am the LORD, I do not change; Therefore you are not consumed. O sons of Jacob.

#### 1 Corinthians 4:1-5

<sup>1</sup>Let a man so consider us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. <sup>2</sup>Moreover it is required in stewards that one be found faithful. <sup>3</sup>But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by a human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself. <sup>4</sup>For I know nothing against myself, yet I am not justified by this; but He who judges me is the Lord. <sup>5</sup>Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord comes, who will both bring to light the hidden things of darkness and reveal the counsels of the hearts. Then each one's praise will come from God.

#### Matthew 11:2-10

<sup>2</sup>And when John had heard in prison about the works of Christ, he sent two of his disciples <sup>3</sup>and said to Him, "Are You the Coming One, or do we look for another?" <sup>4</sup>Jesus answered and said to them, "Go and tell John the things which you hear and see: <sup>5</sup>"*The* blind see and the lame walk; the lepers are cleansed and *the* deaf hear: *the* dead are raised up and *the* poor have the gospel preached to them. <sup>6</sup>"And blessed is he who is not offended because of Me." <sup>7</sup>As they departed, Jesus began to say to the multitudes concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? 8"But what did you go out to see? A man clothed in soft garments? Indeed, those who wear soft *clothing* are in kings' houses. <sup>9</sup>"But what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I say to you, and more than a prophet. <sup>10</sup>"For this is *he* of whom it is written: 'Behold, I send My messenger before Your face. Who will prepare Your way before You.'



Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity (Acts 2:42) is the central issue to the common reception of the Sacrament of the Altar. Therefore, we ask GUESTS desiring to commune to speak with the pastor before the service so that he may know that you are a member of a congregation in fellowship with Trinity Lutheran Church.
