#54 The Lord Does Not Want Us to Despair Because of Our Sinfulness

In this world there will always be such a difference in regard to person, standing and gifts, so that the one

will be more highly esteemed than the other. Yet on that account we are not unequal before God. And because nothing is recognized before Him except grace, why should anyone be permitted to boast and to be proud? All should humbly recognize the fact that God is the same, notwithstanding the difference in us; He has the same eye upon the poor as upon the rich. Therefore all should learn to trust in God's mercy and grace. Both the righteous and the sinner, the rich and the poor, the strong and the feeble, are in the hands of God. Whatever they possess, they have received from Him. Of themselves they have nothing but sin. Hence no one should exalt himself over others, but all should fear God and be humble. For everything good is a gift of God. God has reason to claim the credit, not we. For us it is becoming to make use of His gifts with thanksgiving and in the fear of God. He will not suffer us to be proud, presumptuous and boastful.

But whilst God forbids all pride on account of piety and other gifts, **He does** not, at the same time, want us to despair on account of our sinfulness.

He rather wants us, in this case, to trust in His mercy and to say: Though I am not as plentifully supplied as others, yet their God is my God and He has promised to be merciful to me also. Hence I will be contented and be faithful in my office or vocation, according to the gifts which He has bestowed; I will despise no one, nor exalt myself, neither will I feel slighted if others are favored more than I. I am well satisfied that the God of others is my God also, who is always the same, notwithstanding the difference in men. 

The Herrin House of Hope will host the 13th annual Family Fun Dayon Sunday, September 8 from 12:30-6:00pm to benefit and celebrate our amazing 12 years of operation and service to the Herrin Community on the grounds of Community of Faith Church and also via a VIRTUAL platform this year.

All the proceeds of the day will go to help support the ministry of the Herrin House of Hope through its' Hot lunch program, thrift store, auxiliary food pantry, GED Classes, and Children's Free Summer Meals Program, all a part of our broad-based ministry which was designed by the partnership of churches in the Herrin area to give people a boost in fighting poverty and overcoming times of hardship.

The House of Hope is currently providing meals Monday-Friday, each-and-every week, for between 150-200 people a day or around 750-1000 meals per week. During the height of the Covid shutdown,we saw demands dramatically increase to nearly 300-500 meals a day, to as many as 2818 per week at the height. Through the crisis, the House of Hope has been there every day, as an essential emergency feeding center for the last 12 years providing some 400,000 meals. Everyone that needs a meal—receives one at the House of Hope thanks to incredible community support!

In summary during our 12 years of operation from 2013-2024:

- •Served some 400,000 meals for needy adults and children.
- •Served over 35,000 persons through our auxiliary emergency food pantry& commodities distribution programsince it opened in July 2014, 10 years ago.
- •Served over 20,000 people in our Thrift Store, since it opened in October 2014.
- •Seen over 500+ students go through our on-site GED Program led by John A. Logan Jr. College, since it began in 2014.
- •Now in our 8th Summer (May 30 to August 31) offering our Children's Free Summer Meals Program. We have fed over 25,000 meals to children 0-18.
- •Blessed with over 18,000 volunteer days served by those saints who have come in and out of our doors, just this year,to share the Hope and Love of Christ with those that need ahand of Hope in the Herrin Community, through a day of service.

This year's Family Fun Day has a goal of raising some \$75,000 during the event day through the proceeds from food, children's rides, adult activities, sponsorships, and donations, all of which will be used to run our operations in the year ahead.
