

VIGIL OF EASTER
Celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord
and our Baptism

(There is no prelude. The congregation gathers outside the church nave. All are given candles, later to be lighted from the paschal candle.)

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT

(In the semi-darkness a fire is kindled.)

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the [+] Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: AMEN

Pastor: Beloved in the Lord, on this most holy night our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life. This is the Passover of the Lord in which, by hearing his Word and celebrating his sacraments, we share in his victory over death.

Pastor: Let us pray.

O God, you are like a refiner's fire, and your Spirit enkindles the hearts of your faithful people with the fire of your love. Bless, we implore you, this new flame and those who keep this joyful Easter festival that, burning with desire for life with you, we may be found rightly prepared to share in the Feast of Light which has no end; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

People: AMEN

(The Paschal Candle is prepared for use.)

Pastor: Christ Jesus, the same yesterday, today, and forever, the beginning and the ending, the Alpha and Omega.

(The Pastor traces the cross and the Greek letters A and Ω.)

Blessing of the fire and lighting of the candle



Pastor: His are time and eternity; His are the glory and dominion, now and forever.

(The Pastor traces the year upon the candle.)

Pastor: By his wounds we have healing both now and forever. Amen

(The five wax nails are put into the candle.)

Pastor: May the light of Christ, who is risen in glory from the dead, scatter the darkness of our hearts and minds.

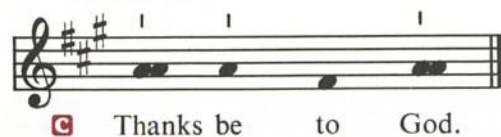
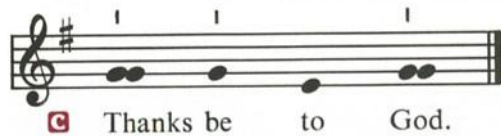
(The Paschal Candle is lit.)

(All light their candles from the paschal candle. The procession into the nave begins. The Paschal candle leads the procession into the darkened church.)

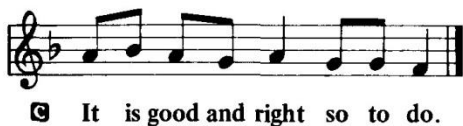
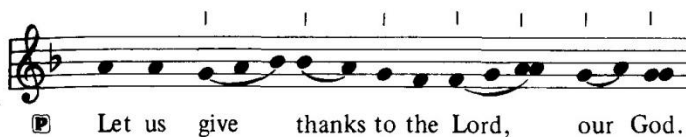
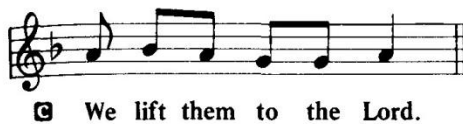
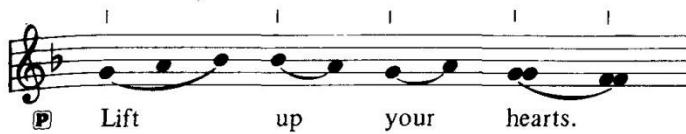


The Easter Proclamation is *chanted*.

Rejoice now, all you heavenly choirs of angels; rejoice now, all creation; sound forth, trumpet of salvation, and proclaim the triumph of our King. Rejoice too, all the earth, in the radiance of the light now poured upon you and made brilliant by the brightness of the everlasting King; know that the ancient darkness has been forever banished. Rejoice, O Church of Christ, clothed in the brightness of this light; let all the house of God ring out with rejoicing, with the praises of all God's faithful people.

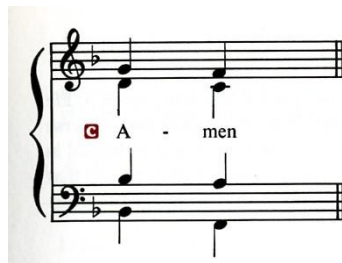

(The Pastor, standing before the font, continues the Easter Proclamation.)

Pastor: It is truly good, right, and salutary that we should at all times and in all places, with all our heart and mind and voice, praise you, O Lord, Holy Father, almighty everlasting God, and your only begotten Son, Jesus Christ. For He is the very Paschal Lamb who offered himself for the sin of the world, who has cleansed us by the shedding of his precious blood. This is the night when you brought our fathers, the children of Israel, out of bondage in Egypt and led them through the Red Sea on dry ground. This is the night when all who believe in Christ are delivered from bondage to sin and are restored to life and immortality. This is the night when Christ, the Life arose from the dead. The seal of the grave is broken and the morning of the new creation breaks forth out of night. Oh, how wonderful and beyond all telling is your mercy toward us, O God, that to redeem a slave you gave your Son. How holy is this night when all wickedness is put to flight and sin is washed away. How holy is this night when innocence is restored to the fallen and joy is given to those downcast. How blessed is this night when man is reconciled to God in Christ. Holy Father, accept now the evening sacrifices of our thanksgiving and praise. Let Christ, the true light and morning star, shine in our hearts, he who gives light to all creation, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



(The people extinguish their candles and may be seated.)

SERVICE OF HOLY BAPTISM

The assisting minister carries the paschal candle to the font and places it in its stand.

PRESENTATION

Candidates for baptism and their sponsors gather at the font.

A sponsor for each candidate presents the candidate with these or similar words:

I present [name] to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

The minister addresses those candidates who are able to answer for themselves:

P. [Name], do you desire to be baptized?

R. I do.

The minister addresses the parents of infants and young children:

P. Who brings this child to be baptized?

R. We do.

ADDRESS TO CANDIDATES AND SPONSORS

When adults or older children are baptized, the minister address the sponsors:

P. In Christian love you have presented [this person/these people] for Holy Baptism.

You should, therefore, faithfully care for *them* and help *them* in every way as God gives you opportunity, that *they* may bear witness to the faith we profess, and that, living in the covenant of *their* Baptism and in communion with the Church, *they* may lead godly lives until the day of Jesus Christ.

If there are also infants or young children to be baptized, the minister addresses the sponsors and parents:

P. In Christian love you have presented [this child/these children] for Holy Baptism.

You should, therefore, faithfully bring *them* to the services of God's house, and teach *them* the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As *they* grow in years, you should place in *their* hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for *their* instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of *their* Baptism and in communion with the Church, *they* may lead godly lives until the day of Jesus Christ.

P. Do you promise to fulfill these obligations?

The parents and sponsors respond:

R. I do.

To you be given praise and honor and worship through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

*A **lighted candle** may be given to each of the baptized (to the sponsor of a young child).*

Receive this burning light. Live always by the light of Christ, and be ever watchful for his coming that you may meet him with joy and enter with him to the marriage feast of the Lamb in his kingdom, which shall have no end.

LAYING ON OF HANDS (Confirmation)

Those who have been baptized and taught the faith, now confess that faith and are welcomed into Christian fellowship to share in all the gifts our Lord has for His Church.

*A sponsor gives a lighted candle to the **confirmand** and says to the pastor:*

I present [names] to acknowledge the gifts which God gave [them/her/him] in holy Baptism.



P. Having just renounced the devil and confessed the Christian faith in the words of the Apostles' Creed, I ask you: Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?

R. I do so intend with the help of God.

P. Do you intend faithfully to conform all your life to the divine Word, to be faithful in the use of God's Word and sacraments, which are his means of grace and in faith, word, and action to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, even to death?

R. I do so intend by the grace of God.

P. [name], child of God, in your baptism you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the ✠ cross of Christ forever.

The Exhortation

Dear friends in Christ! In order that you may receive this Holy Sacrament worthily it becomes you diligently to consider what you must now believe and do.
