Another “Book of the Covenant”

Exodus 25:1-9 **Offerings for the Tabernacle**

¹Then the Lord spoke to Moses, saying:
²“Speak to the children of Israel, that they bring Me an offering. From everyone who gives it willingly with his heart you shall take My offering. ³“And this *is* the offering which you shall take from them: gold, silver, and bronze; ⁴“blue, purple, and scarlet *thread*, fine linen, and goats’ *hair*; ⁵“ram skins dyed red, badger skins, and acacia wood; ⁶“oil for the light, and spices for the anointing oil and for the sweet incense; ⁷“onyx stones, and stones to be set in the ephod and in the breastplate.

⁸“**And let them make Me a sanctuary, that I may dwell among them.** ⁹“According to all that I show you, *that is*, **the pattern** of the tabernacle and **the pattern** of all its furnishings, just so you shall make *it*.



Acts 7:44 “Our fathers had the tabernacle of witness in the wilderness, as He appointed, instructing Moses to make it **according to the pattern that he had seen...**

Hebrews 8:4-5, “For if He were on earth, He would not be a priest, since there are priests who offer the gifts according to the law; ⁵who serve **the copy and shadow of the heavenly things**, as Moses was divinely instructed when he was about to make the tabernacle. For He said, “See *that* you make all things **according to the pattern shown you on the mountain.**”

Exodus 25:10-22 **The Ark**

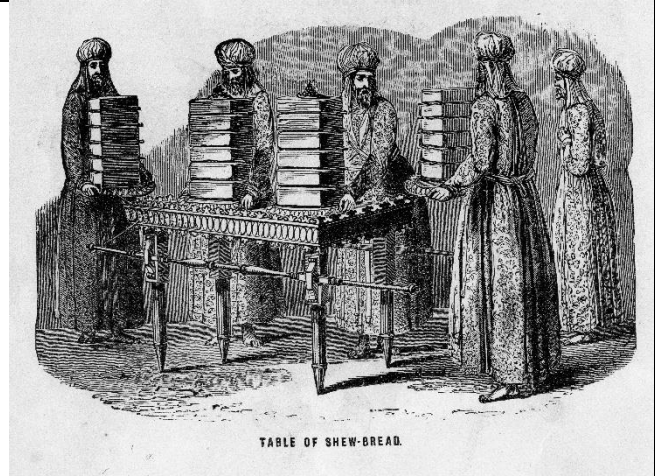
¹⁰“And they shall make **an ark** of acacia wood; two and a half cubits *shall be* its length, a cubit and a half its width, and a cubit and a half its height. ¹¹“And you shall overlay it with pure gold, inside and out you shall overlay it, and shall make on it a molding of gold all around. ¹²“You shall cast four rings of gold for it, and put *them* in its four corners; two rings *shall be* on one side, and two rings on the other side. ¹³“And you shall make poles of acacia wood, and overlay them with gold. ¹⁴“You shall put the poles into the rings on the sides of the ark, that the ark may be carried by them. ¹⁵“The poles shall be in the rings of the ark; they shall not be taken from it. ¹⁶“And you shall put into the ark **the Testimony** which I will give you.

¹⁷“You shall make **a mercy seat** of pure gold; two and a half cubits *shall be* its length and a cubit and a half its width. ¹⁸“And you shall make two cherubim of gold; of hammered work you shall make them at the two ends of the mercy seat. ¹⁹“Make one cherub at one end, and the other cherub at the other end; you shall make the cherubim at the two ends of it *of one piece* with the mercy seat. ²⁰“And the cherubim shall stretch out *their* wings above, covering the mercy seat with their wings, and they shall face one another; the faces of the cherubim *shall be* toward the mercy seat. ²¹“You shall put the mercy seat on top of the ark, and in the ark you shall put **the Testimony** that I will give you. ²²“**And there I will meet with you, and I will speak with you from above the mercy seat, from between the two cherubim which *are* on the ark of the Testimony, about everything which I will give you in commandment to the children of Israel.**



Exodus 25:23-30 **The Table**

²³“You shall also make **a table** of **acacia wood**; two cubits *shall be* its length, a cubit its width, and a cubit and a half its height. ²⁴“And you shall overlay it with pure gold, and make a molding of gold all around. ²⁵“You shall make for it a frame of a handbreadth all around, and you shall make a gold molding for the frame all around. ²⁶“And you shall make for it four rings of gold, and put the rings on the four corners that *are* at its four legs. ²⁷“The rings shall be close to the frame, as holders



for the poles to bear the table. ²⁸“And you shall make the poles of acacia wood, and overlay them with gold, that the table may be carried with them. ²⁹“You shall make **its dishes, its pans, its pitchers, and its bowls** for pouring. You shall make them of pure gold. ³⁰“And you shall set **the showbread** on the table before Me always.

Exodus 25:31-40 **The Lampstand**

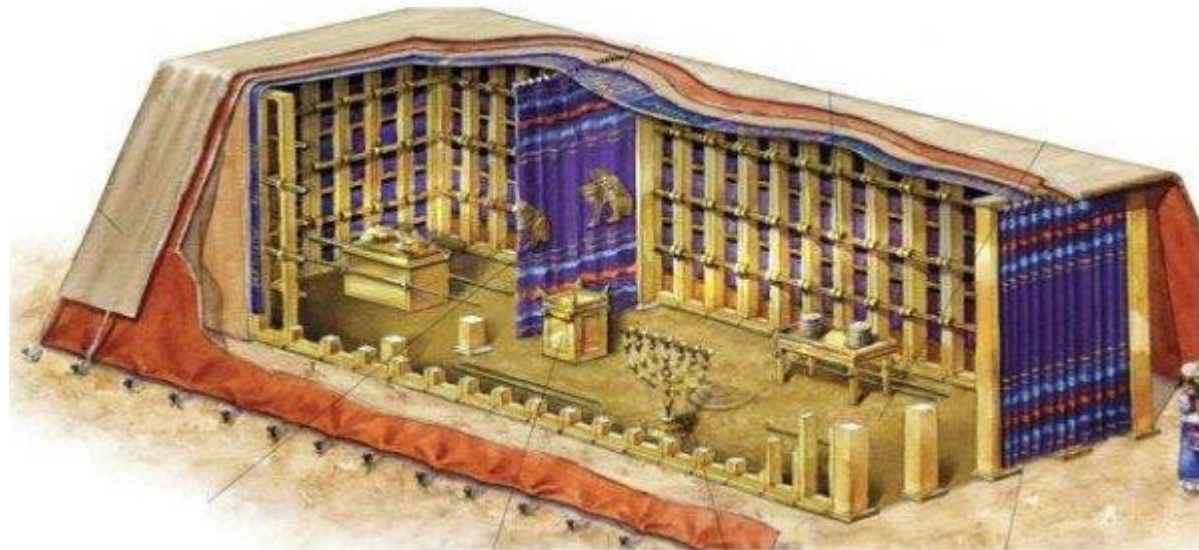
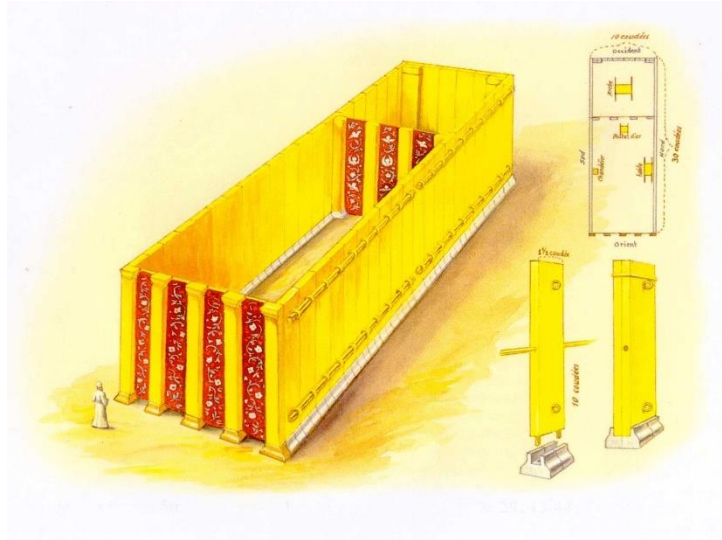
³¹“You shall also make **a lampstand** of pure gold; the lampstand shall be of hammered work. Its shaft, its branches, its bowls, its *ornamental* knobs, and flowers shall be *of one piece*. ³²“And six branches shall come out of its sides: three branches of the lampstand out of one side, and three branches of the lampstand out of the other side. ³³“Three bowls *shall be* made like almond *blossoms* on one branch, *with an ornamental knob and a flower*, and three bowls made like almond *blossoms* on the other branch, *with an ornamental knob and a flower*—and so for the six branches that come out of the lampstand.

³⁴“On the lampstand itself four bowls *shall be* made like almond *blossoms*, *each with its ornamental knob and flower*. ³⁵“And *there shall be* a knob under the *first* two branches of the same, a knob under the *second* two branches of the same, and a knob under the *third* two branches of the same, according to the six branches that extend from the lampstand. ³⁶“Their knobs and their branches *shall be of one piece*; all of it *shall be* one hammered piece of pure gold. ³⁷“You shall make seven lamps for it, and they shall arrange its lamps so that they give light in front of it. ³⁸“And **its wick-trimmers and their trays** *shall be* of pure gold. ³⁹“It shall be made of a talent of pure gold, with all these utensils. ⁴⁰“And see to it that you make *them* according to the pattern which was shown you on the mountain.



Exodus 26:1-37 **The Tabernacle**

¹“Moreover you shall make the **tabernacle** with **ten curtains** of fine woven linen and blue, purple, and scarlet *thread*; with artistic designs of cherubim you shall weave them. ²“The length of each curtain *shall be* twenty-eight cubits, and the width of each curtain four cubits. And every one of the curtains shall have the same measurements. ³“Five curtains shall be coupled to one another, and *the other* five curtains *shall be* coupled to one another. ⁴“And you shall make **loops of blue yarn** on the edge of the curtain on the selvedge of *one* set, and likewise you shall do on the outer edge of *the other* curtain of the second set.



⁵“Fifty loops you shall make in the one curtain, and fifty loops you shall make on the edge of the curtain that *is* on the end of the second set, that the loops may be clasped to one another. ⁶“And you shall make **fifty clasps of gold**, and couple the curtains together with the clasps, so that it may be one tabernacle.

⁷“You shall also make **curtains of goats’ hair**, to be a tent over the tabernacle. You shall make eleven curtains. ⁸“The length of each curtain *shall be* thirty cubits, and the width of each curtain four cubits; and the eleven curtains shall all have the same measurements. ⁹“And you shall couple five curtains by themselves and six curtains by themselves, and you shall double over the sixth curtain at the forefront of the tent. ¹⁰“You shall make fifty loops on the edge of the curtain that is outermost in *one* set, and fifty loops on the edge of the curtain of the second set. ¹¹“And you shall make **fifty bronze clasps**, put the clasps into the loops, and couple the tent together, that it may be one. ¹²“The remnant that remains of the curtains of the tent, the half curtain that remains, shall hang over the back of the tabernacle. ¹³“And a cubit on one side and a cubit on the other side, of what remains of the length of the curtains of the tent, shall

hang over the sides of the tabernacle, on this side and on that side, to cover it. ¹⁴“You shall also make **a covering of ram skins dyed red** for the tent, and **a covering of badger skins** above that.

¹⁵“And for the tabernacle you shall make **the boards of acacia wood**, standing upright. ¹⁶“Ten cubits *shall be* the length of a board, and a cubit and a half *shall be* the width of each board. ¹⁷“Two tenons *shall be* in each board for binding one to another. Thus you shall make for all the boards of the tabernacle. ¹⁸“And you shall make the boards for the tabernacle, twenty boards for the south side. ¹⁹“You shall make **forty sockets of silver** under the twenty boards: two sockets under each of the boards for its two tenons. ²⁰“And for the second side of the tabernacle, the north side, *there shall be* twenty boards ²¹“and their forty sockets of silver: two sockets under each of the boards. ²²“For the far side of the tabernacle, westward, you shall make six boards. ²³“And you shall also make two boards for the two back corners of the tabernacle. ²⁴“They shall be coupled together at the bottom and they shall be coupled together at the top by one ring. Thus it shall be for both of them. They shall be for the two corners. ²⁵“So there shall be eight boards with their sockets of silver—sixteen sockets—two sockets under each board.

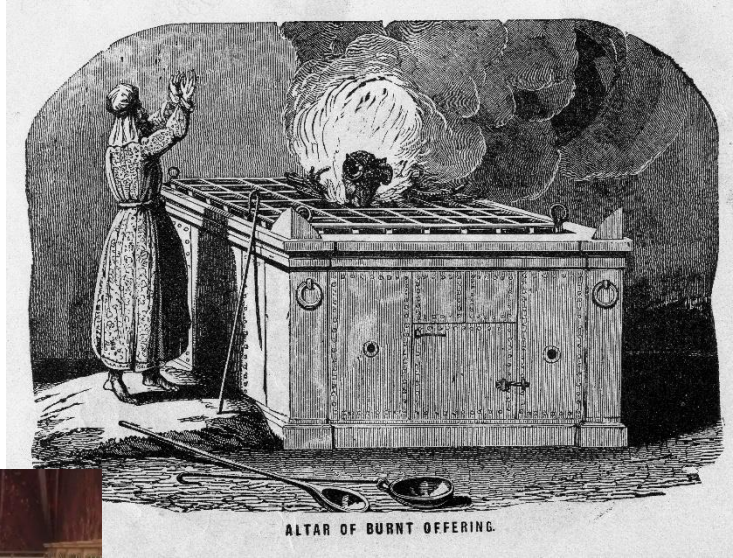
²⁶“And you shall make **bars of acacia wood**: five for the boards on one side of the tabernacle, ²⁷“five bars for the boards on the other side of the tabernacle, and five bars for the boards of the side of the tabernacle, for the far side westward. ²⁸“The middle bar shall pass through the midst of the boards from end to end. ²⁹“You shall overlay the boards with gold, make their rings of gold *as* holders for the bars, and overlay the bars with gold. ³⁰“And you shall raise up the tabernacle according to its pattern which you were shown on the mountain.

³¹“You shall make **a veil woven of blue, purple, and scarlet thread, and fine woven linen**. It shall be woven with an artistic design of cherubim. ³²“You shall hang it upon the four pillars of acacia *wood* overlaid with gold. Their hooks *shall be* gold, upon four sockets of silver. ³³“And you shall hang the veil from the clasps. Then you shall bring the ark of the Testimony in there, behind the veil. The veil shall be a divider for you between the holy *place* and the Most Holy. ³⁴“You shall put the mercy seat upon the ark of the Testimony in the Most Holy. ³⁵“**You shall set the table outside the veil, and the lampstand across from the table on the side of the tabernacle toward the south; and you shall put the table on the north side.**

³⁶“You shall make **a screen for the door of the tabernacle**, *woven of* blue, purple, and scarlet *thread*, and fine woven linen, made by a weaver. ³⁷“And you shall make for the screen five pillars of acacia *wood*, and overlay them with gold; their hooks *shall be of* gold, and you shall cast five sockets of bronze for them.

Exodus 27:1-8 **The Altar of Burnt Offering**

¹“You shall make **an altar of acacia wood**, five cubits long and five cubits wide—the altar shall be square—and its height *shall be* three cubits. ²“You shall make **its horns** on its four corners; its horns shall be of one piece with it. And you shall overlay it **with bronze**. ³“Also you shall make **its pans** to receive its ashes, and **its shovels and its basins**



and its forks and its firepans; you shall make all its utensils of bronze. ⁴“You shall make **a grate** for it, a network of bronze; and on the network you shall make four bronze rings at its four corners. ⁵“You shall put it under the rim of the altar beneath, that the network may be midway up the altar. ⁶“And

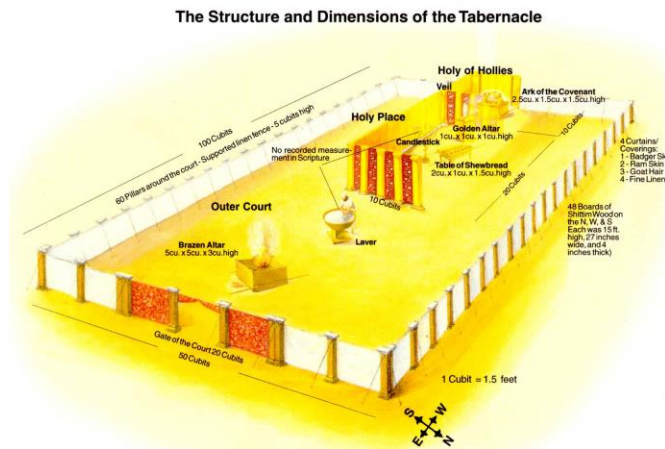
you shall make poles for the altar, poles of acacia wood, and overlay them with bronze. ⁷“The poles shall be put in the rings, and the poles shall be on the two sides of the altar to bear it. ⁸“You shall make it hollow with boards; as it was shown you on the mountain, so shall they make *it*.

Exodus 27:9-19 **The Courtyard**

⁹“You shall also make **the court of the tabernacle**. For the south side *there shall be hangings* for the court *made of* fine woven linen, one hundred cubits long for one side. ¹⁰“And its twenty pillars and their twenty sockets *shall be* bronze. The hooks of the pillars and their bands *shall be* silver. ¹¹“Likewise along the length of the north side *there shall be* hangings one hundred cubits long, with its twenty pillars and their twenty sockets of bronze, and the hooks of the pillars and their bands of silver.

¹²“And along the width of the court on the west side *shall be* hangings of fifty cubits, with their ten pillars and their ten sockets. ¹³“The width of the court on the east side *shall be* fifty cubits. ¹⁴“The hangings on *one side of the gate shall be* fifteen cubits, with their three pillars and their three sockets. ¹⁵“And on the other side *shall be* hangings of fifteen cubits, with their three pillars and their three sockets.

¹⁶“For **the gate of the court** *there shall be* a screen twenty cubits long, woven of blue, purple, and scarlet thread, and fine woven linen, made by a weaver. It *shall have* four pillars and four sockets. ¹⁷“All the pillars around the court shall have bands of silver; their hooks *shall be* of silver and their sockets of bronze. ¹⁸“The length of the court *shall be* one hundred cubits, the width fifty throughout, and the height five cubits, *made of* fine woven linen, and its sockets of bronze. ¹⁹“All **the utensils** of the tabernacle for all its service, all its pegs, and all the pegs of the court, *shall be* of bronze.

Exodus 27:20-21 **Oil for the Lampstand**

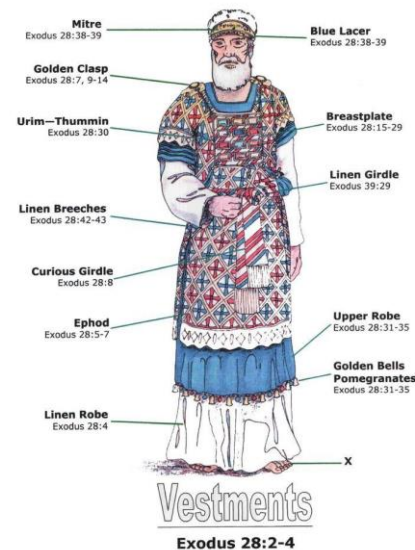
²⁰“And you shall command the children of Israel that they bring you **pure oil of pressed olives** for the light, to cause the lamp to burn continually. ²¹“In the tabernacle of meeting, outside the veil which *is* before the Testimony, Aaron and his sons shall tend it from evening until morning before the Lord. *It shall be* a statute forever to their generations on behalf of the children of Israel.

Exodus 28:1-5 **The Priestly Garments**

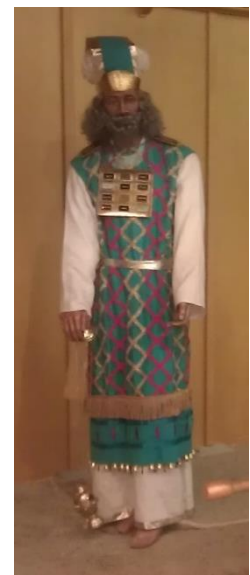
¹“Now take Aaron your brother, and his sons with him, from among the children of Israel, that he may minister to Me as priest, Aaron *and* Aaron’s sons: Nadab, Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar. ²“And you shall make holy garments for Aaron your brother, for glory and for beauty. ³“So you shall speak to all *who are* gifted artisans, whom I have filled with the spirit of wisdom, that they may make Aaron’s garments, to consecrate him, that he may minister to Me as priest. ⁴“And these *are* the garments which they shall make: **a breastplate, an ephod, a robe, a skillfully woven tunic, a turban, and a sash.** So they shall make holy garments for Aaron your brother and his sons, that he may minister to Me as priest.

⁵“They shall take the gold, blue, purple, and scarlet thread, and fine linen,



Exodus 28:6-14 **The Ephod**

⁶“and they shall make **the ephod of gold, blue, purple, and scarlet thread, and fine woven linen,** artistically worked. ⁷“It shall have two shoulder straps joined at its two edges, and *so* it shall be joined together. ⁸“And the intricately woven band of the ephod, which *is* on it, shall be of the same workmanship, *made of* gold, blue, purple, and scarlet thread, and fine woven linen. ⁹“Then you shall take **two onyx stones** and engrave on them the names of the sons of Israel: ¹⁰“six of their names on one stone, and six names on the other stone, in order of their birth. ¹¹“With the work of an engraver in stone, *like* the engravings of a signet, you shall engrave the two stones with the names of the sons of Israel. You shall set them in settings of gold. ¹²“And you shall put the two stones on the shoulders of the ephod *as* memorial stones for the sons of Israel. So Aaron shall bear their names before the Lord on his two shoulders as a memorial. ¹³“You shall also make settings of gold, ¹⁴“and you shall make two chains of pure gold like braided cords, and fasten the braided chains to the settings.



Exodus 28:15-30 **The Breastplate**

¹⁵“You shall make **the breastplate of judgment**. Artistically woven according to the workmanship of the ephod you shall make it: of gold, blue, purple, and scarlet *thread*, and fine woven linen, you shall make it. ¹⁶“It shall be doubled into a square: a span *shall be* its length, and a span *shall be* its width. ¹⁷“And you shall put settings of stones in it, four rows of stones: *The first row shall be* a sardius, a topaz, and an emerald; *this shall be* the first row; ¹⁸“the second row *shall be* a turquoise, a sapphire, and a diamond; ¹⁹“the third row, a jacinth, an agate, and an amethyst; ²⁰“and the fourth row, a beryl, an onyx, and a jasper. They shall be set in gold settings. ²¹“And the stones shall have the names of the sons of Israel, twelve according to their names, *like* the engravings of a signet, each one with its own name; they shall be according to the twelve tribes.

²²“You shall make **chains** for the breastplate at the end, like braided cords of pure gold. ²³“And you shall make two rings of gold for the breastplate, and put the two rings on the two ends of the breastplate. ²⁴“Then you shall put the two braided *chains* of gold in the two rings which are on the ends of the breastplate; ²⁵“and the *other* two ends of the two braided *chains* you shall fasten to the two settings, and put them on the shoulder straps of the ephod in the front.

²⁶“You shall make **two rings of gold**, and put them on the two ends of the breastplate, on the edge of it, which is on the inner side of the ephod. ²⁷“And two *other* rings of gold you shall make, and put them on the two shoulder straps, underneath the ephod toward its front, right at the seam above the intricately woven band of the ephod. ²⁸“They shall bind the breastplate by means of its rings to the rings of the ephod, using a blue cord, so that it is above the intricately woven band of the ephod, and so that the breastplate does not come loose from the ephod. ²⁹“So **Aaron shall bear the names of the sons of Israel on the breastplate** of judgment over his heart, when he goes into the holy *place*, as a memorial before the Lord continually. ³⁰“And you shall put in the breastplate of judgment the Urim and the Thummim, and they shall be over Aaron’s heart when he goes in before the Lord. So Aaron shall bear the judgment of the children of Israel over his heart before the Lord continually.



Exodus 28:31-43 **Other Priestly Garments**

³¹“You shall make **the robe** of the ephod all of blue. ³²“There shall be an opening for his head in the middle of it; it shall have a woven binding all around its opening, like the opening in a coat of mail, so that it does not tear.

³³“And upon its hem you shall make pomegranates of blue, purple, and scarlet, all around its hem, and bells of gold between them all around: ³⁴“a golden bell and a pomegranate, a golden bell and a pomegranate, upon the hem of the robe all around. ³⁵“And it shall be upon Aaron when he ministers, and its sound will be heard when he goes into the holy *place* before the Lord and when he comes out, that he may not die.


³⁶“You shall also make **a plate of pure gold** and engrave on it, *like* the engraving of a signet: **HOLINESS TO THE LORD**. ³⁷“And you shall put it on a blue cord, that it may be on the turban; it shall be on the front of the turban. ³⁸“So it shall be on Aaron’s forehead, that Aaron may bear the iniquity of the holy things which the children of Israel hallow in all their holy gifts; and it shall always be on his forehead, that they may be accepted before the Lord.


³⁹“You shall skillfully weave **the tunic** of fine linen *thread*, you shall make the turban of fine linen, and you shall make the sash of woven work.


⁴⁰“For Aaron’s sons you shall make tunics, and you shall make **sashes** for them. And you shall make hats for them, for glory and beauty. ⁴¹“So you shall put them on Aaron your brother and on his sons with him. You shall anoint them, consecrate them, and sanctify them, that they may minister to Me as priests. ⁴²“And you shall make for them **linen trousers** to cover their nakedness; they shall reach from the waist to the thighs. ⁴³“They shall be on Aaron and on his sons when they come into the tabernacle of meeting, or when they come near the altar to minister in the holy *place*, that they do not incur iniquity and die. *It shall be* a statute forever to him and his descendants after him.

<p>¹⁰“You shall also have the bull brought before the tabernacle of meeting, and Aaron and his sons shall put their hands on the head of the bull. ¹¹“Then you shall kill the bull before the Lord, <i>by the door of the tabernacle of meeting.</i> ¹²“You shall take <i>some</i> of the blood of the bull and put <i>it</i> on the horns of the altar with your finger, and pour all the blood beside the base of the altar. ¹³“And you shall take all the fat that covers the entrails, the fatty lobe <i>attached</i> to the liver, and the two kidneys and the fat that <i>is</i> on them, and burn <i>them</i> on the altar. ¹⁴“But the flesh of the bull, with its skin and its offal, you shall burn with fire outside the camp. <p>¹⁵“You shall also take one ram, and Aaron and his sons shall put their hands on the head of the ram; ¹⁶“and you shall kill the ram, and you shall take its blood and sprinkle <i>it</i> all around on the altar. ¹⁷“Then you shall cut the ram in pieces, wash its entrails and its legs, and put <i>them</i> with its pieces and with its head. ¹⁸“And you shall burn the whole ram on the altar. It is a burnt offering to the Lord; it is a sweet aroma, an offering made by fire to the Lord.</p>	 <p>First ram offered as burnt offering Leviticus 8:18-21</p> <p>An ordinary burnt offering (Lev 1:3-9) to appoint the ram as a substitute for the people through the laying on of hands.</p>		

<p>¹⁹“You shall also take the other ram, and Aaron and his sons shall put their hands on the head of the ram. ²⁰“Then you shall kill the ram, and take some of its blood and put it on the tip of the right ear of Aaron and on the tip of the right ear of his sons, on the thumb of their right hand and on the big toe of their right foot, and sprinkle the blood all around on the altar. ²¹“And you shall take some of the blood that is on the altar, and some of the anointing oil, and sprinkle it on Aaron and on his garments, on his sons and on the garments of his sons with him; and he and his garments shall be hallowed, and his sons and his sons’ garments with him.</p> <p>²²“Also you shall take the fat of the ram, the fat tail, the fat that covers the entrails, the fatty lobe <i>attached</i> to the liver, the two kidneys and the fat on them, the right thigh (for it <i>is</i> a ram of consecration), ²³“one loaf of bread, one cake <i>made with</i> oil, and one wafer from the basket of the unleavened bread that <i>is</i> before the Lord; ²⁴“and you shall put all these in the hands of Aaron and in the hands of his sons, and you shall wave them as a wave offering before the Lord.</p> 	<p>Second ram offered as an ordination offering Leviticus 8:22-29</p> <p>This ram was a consecration (peace) offering giving the recipients the possession and enjoyment of the privileges of the priesthood.</p> <p>The extremity of 3 organs anointed</p> <p>Three kinds of pastry</p>
<p>²⁵“You shall receive them back from their hands and burn them on the altar as a burnt offering, as a sweet aroma before the Lord. It <i>is</i> an offering made by fire to the Lord.</p> <p>²⁶“Then you shall take the breast of the ram of Aaron’s consecration and wave it <i>as</i> a wave offering before the Lord; and it shall be your portion. ²⁷“And from the ram of the consecration you shall consecrate the breast of the wave offering which is waved, and the thigh of the heave offering which is raised, of <i>that</i> which <i>is</i> for Aaron and of <i>that</i> which is for his sons. ²⁸“It shall be from the children of Israel <i>for</i> Aaron and his sons by a statute forever. ⁴⁰“With the one lamb shall be one-tenth of an *ephah* of flour mixed with one-fourth of a hin of pressed oil, and one-fourth of a hin of wine as a **drink offering**.

⁴¹“And the other lamb you shall offer at twilight; and you shall offer with it the **grain offering** and **the drink offering**, as in the morning, for a sweet aroma, an offering made by fire to the Lord.

⁴²“*This shall be a continual burnt offering* throughout your generations *at the door of the tabernacle of meeting before the Lord, where I will meet you to speak with you.* ⁴³“**And there I will meet with the children of Israel, and the tabernacle shall be sanctified by My glory.** ⁴⁴“So I will consecrate the tabernacle of meeting and the altar. I will also consecrate both Aaron and his sons to minister to Me as priests. ⁴⁵“I will dwell among the children of Israel and will be their God. ⁴⁶“And they shall know that I *am* the Lord their God, who brought them up out of the land of Egypt, that I may dwell among them. I *am* the Lord their God.



Exodus 30:1-10 **The Altar of Incense**

¹“You shall make **an altar to burn incense** on; you shall make it of acacia wood. ²“A cubit *shall be* its length and a cubit its width—it shall be square—and two cubits *shall be* its height. Its horns *shall be* of one piece with it. ³“And you shall overlay its top, its sides all around, and its horns with pure gold; and you shall make for it a molding of gold all around. ⁴“Two gold rings you shall make for it, under the molding on both its sides. You shall place *them* on its two sides, and they will be holders for the poles with which to bear it. ⁵“You shall make the poles of acacia wood, and overlay them with gold. ⁶“And you shall put it before the veil that *is* before the ark of the Testimony, before the mercy seat that *is* over the Testimony, where I will meet with you. ⁷“Aaron shall burn on it sweet incense every morning; when he tends the lamps, he shall burn incense on it. ⁸“And when Aaron lights the lamps at twilight, he shall burn incense on it, **a perpetual incense before the Lord throughout your generations.** ⁹“You shall not offer strange incense on it, or a **burnt offering**, or a **grain offering**; nor shall you pour a **drink offering** on it. ¹⁰“And Aaron shall make atonement upon its horns once a year with the blood of **the sin offering** of atonement; once a year he shall make atonement upon it throughout your generations. *It is most holy to the Lord.*”

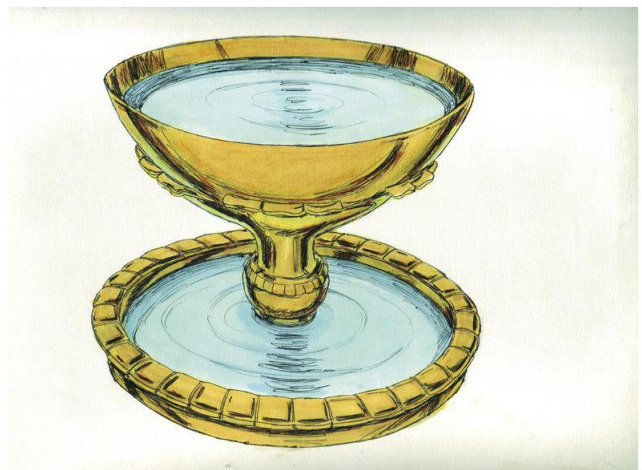


Exodus 30:11-16 **Atonement Money**

¹¹Then the Lord spoke to Moses, saying: ¹²“When you take **the census** of the children of Israel for their number, then every man shall give a ransom for himself to the Lord, when you number them, that there may be no plague among them when *you* number them. ¹³“This is what everyone among those who are numbered shall give: half a shekel according to the shekel of the sanctuary (a shekel *is* twenty gerahs). The half-shekel *shall be* an offering to the Lord. ¹⁴“Everyone included among those who are numbered, from twenty years old and above, shall give an offering to the Lord. ¹⁵“The rich shall not give more and the poor shall not give less than half a shekel, when *you* give an offering to the Lord, to make atonement for yourselves. ¹⁶“And you shall take the atonement money of the children of Israel, and shall appoint it for the service of the tabernacle of meeting, that it may be a memorial for the children of Israel before the Lord, to make atonement for yourselves.”

Exodus 30:17-21 **Basin for Washing**

¹⁷Then the Lord spoke to Moses, saying: ¹⁸“You shall also make **a laver of bronze**, with its base also of bronze, for washing. You shall put it **between the tabernacle of meeting and the altar**. And you shall put water in it, ¹⁹“for Aaron and his sons shall wash their hands and their feet in water from it. ²⁰“When they go into the tabernacle of meeting, or when they come near the altar to minister, to burn an offering made by fire to the Lord, they shall wash with water, lest they die. ²¹“So they shall wash their hands and their feet, lest they die. And it shall be a statute forever to them—to him and his descendants throughout their generations.”



Exodus 30:22-33 **Anointing Oil**

²²Moreover the Lord spoke to Moses, saying: ²³“Also take for yourself quality spices—five hundred *shekels* of liquid myrrh, half as much sweet-smelling cinnamon (two hundred and fifty *shekels*), two hundred and fifty *shekels* of sweet-smelling cane, ²⁴“five hundred *shekels* of cassia, according to the shekel of the sanctuary, and a hin of olive oil. ²⁵“And you shall make from these a holy anointing oil, an ointment compounded according to the art of the perfumer. It shall be **a holy anointing oil**. ²⁶“With it you shall anoint the tabernacle of meeting and the ark of the Testimony; ²⁷“the table and all its utensils, the lampstand and its utensils, and the altar of incense; ²⁸“the altar of burnt offering with all its utensils, and the laver and its base. ²⁹“You shall consecrate them, that they may be most holy; whatever touches them must be holy. ³⁰“And you shall anoint Aaron and his sons, and consecrate them, that *they* may minister to Me as priests. ³¹“And you shall speak to the children of Israel, saying: ‘This shall be a holy anointing oil to Me throughout your generations. ³²“**It shall not be poured on man’s flesh;** nor shall you make *any other* like it, according to its composition. It *is* holy, *and* it shall be holy to you. ³³“Whoever compounds *any* like it, or whoever puts *any* of it on an outsider, shall be cut off from his people.’ ”

Exodus 30:34-38 [Incense](#)

³⁴And the Lord said to Moses: “Take sweet spices, stacte and onycha and galbanum, and pure frankincense with *these* sweet spices; there shall be equal amounts of each. ³⁵“You shall make of these **an incense**, a compound according to the art of the perfumer, salted, pure, *and* holy. ³⁶“And you shall beat *some* of it very fine, and put some of it before the Testimony in the tabernacle of meeting where I will meet with you. It shall be most holy to you. ³⁷“But *as for* the incense which you shall make, you shall not make any for yourselves, according to its composition. It shall be to you holy for the Lord. ³⁸“Whoever makes *any* like it, to smell it, he shall be cut off from his people.”

Exodus 31:1-11 [Bezalel and Oholiab](#)

¹Then the Lord spoke to Moses, saying: ²“See, I have called by name **Bezalel** the son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah. ³“And I have filled him with the Spirit of God, in wisdom, in understanding, in knowledge, and in all *manner of* workmanship, ⁴“to design artistic works, to work in gold, in silver, in bronze, ⁵“in cutting jewels for setting, in carving wood, and to work in all *manner of* workmanship.

⁶“And I, indeed I, have appointed with him **Aholiab** the son of Ahisamach, of the tribe of Dan; and I have put wisdom in the hearts of all who are gifted artisans, that they may make all that I have commanded you: ⁷“the tabernacle of meeting, the ark of the Testimony and the mercy seat that *is* on it, and all the furniture of the tabernacle— ⁸“the table and its utensils, the pure *gold* lampstand with all its utensils, the altar of incense, ⁹“the altar of burnt offering with all its utensils, and the laver and its base— ¹⁰“the garments of ministry, the holy garments for Aaron the priest and the garments of his sons, to minister as priests, ¹¹“and the anointing oil and sweet incense for the holy *place*. According to all that I have commanded you they shall do.”

Exodus 31:12-17 [The Sabbath](#)

¹²And the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, ¹³“Speak also to the children of Israel, saying: ‘Surely My Sabbaths you shall keep, for it *is* a sign between Me and you throughout your generations, that *you* may know that I *am* the Lord who sanctifies you. ¹⁴“You shall keep the Sabbath, therefore, for *it is* holy to you. Everyone who profanes it shall surely be put to death; for whoever does *any* work on it, that person shall be cut off from among his people. ¹⁵“Work shall be done for six days, but the seventh *is* the Sabbath of rest, holy to the Lord. Whoever does *any* work on the Sabbath day, he shall surely be put to death. ¹⁶“Therefore the children of Israel shall keep the Sabbath, to observe the Sabbath throughout their generations *as* a perpetual covenant. ¹⁷“It is a sign between Me and the children of Israel forever; for *in* six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, and on the seventh day He rested and was refreshed.”
