

### **Lamentations 3:22-33**

<sup>22</sup> Through the LORD's mercies we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. <sup>23</sup> They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness. <sup>24</sup> "The LORD is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I hope in Him!" <sup>25</sup> The LORD is good to those who wait for Him, to the soul who seeks Him. <sup>26</sup> It is good that one should hope and wait quietly for the salvation of the LORD. <sup>27</sup> It is good for a man to bear the yoke in his youth. <sup>28</sup> Let him sit alone and keep silent, because God has laid it on him; <sup>29</sup> Let him put his mouth in the dust—there may yet be hope. <sup>30</sup> Let him give his cheek to the one who strikes him, and be full of reproach. <sup>31</sup> For the Lord will not cast off forever. <sup>32</sup> Though He causes grief, yet He will show compassion according to the multitude of His mercies. <sup>33</sup> For He does not afflict willingly, nor grieve the children of men.

### **2 Corinthians 9:6-10**

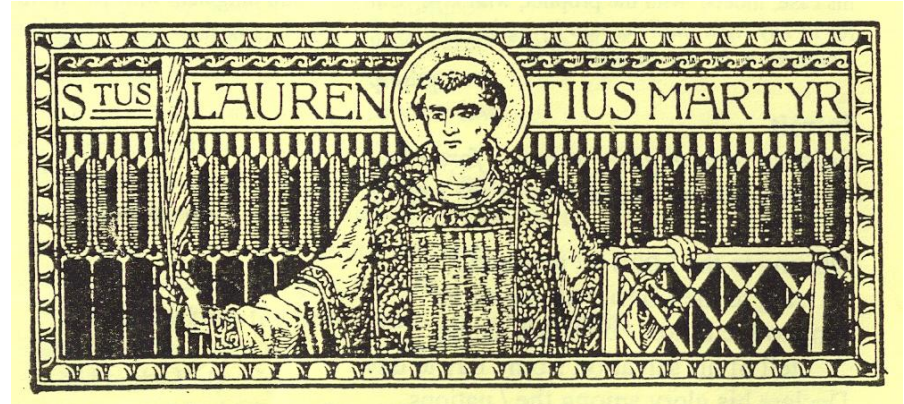

If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor."

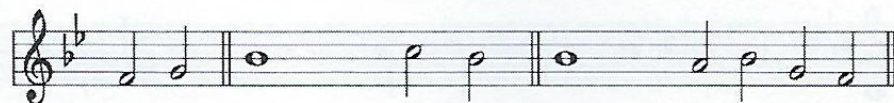




